Global Health Nursing

Nursing Leadership

The course also provides strategies for handling challenges that arise in health care organizations in order to better assist nurse leaders in creating a healing environment for both consumers and healthcare providers.

Students will engage in role play activities to learn how to respond to ethical conflicts among healthcare team members in clinical settings.

Nursing Research

Nursing Research stresses the role of the nurse as both researcher and research consumer and includes both quantitative and qualitative research. This course teaches students the skills necessary to critically read, evaluate, and integrate nursing research into evidence-based practice. This course also focuses on the evaluation and utilization of research necessary to address patient needs and provide quality care as well as the methods, appraisal, and utilization of research findings toward the goal of implementing best practices.

Community Health Nursing

This course further explores population-focused decision making, community-based strategies for health promotion and disease prevention, primary care services, and disaster prevention and planning which are emerging issues at the forefront of healthcare services.

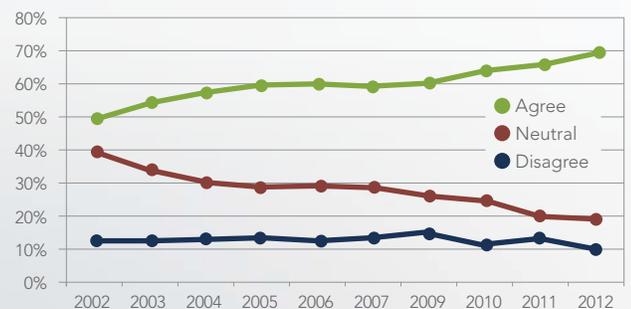
